1. The longest conclave lasted almost three years (1268 – 1271 for 1,006 days). Pope Gregory X was elected, and a new format of the conclave was born.
2. Cardinals will be on a strict diet to prevent secret messaging.
3. The next Pope does not have to be a cardinal. In fact, any baptized Catholic male can be appointed as Pope.
4. The conclave has only been in the Sistine Chapel since 1878. Before that it could move around. It was held in France from 1314-1316, and in Germany from 1415-1417.
5. Only Cardinals under the age of 80 can participate in the conclave but the Pope can be any age even a teenager. (Pope John XII was 18 when he was elected Pope in 955). Eligible Cardinals can choose not to participate in the conclave.

Unknown Facts about the Pope

The Pope has to be multilingual. The Pope goes to confession. The Pope is the head of his own country. The pope has his own hospital. The Pope is one of the five most powerful people in the world. The pope has a bank to worry about. The pope's death is declared in a very specific way.

The business meetings went smoothly because everyone came prepared to work, to move issues along respectfully and fairly, and to vote. Your home courts should be very proud of their delegates, and I hope to see even more members attend in two years. Flat Pat was my roommate during the convention, and we had a blast! My own local court, Regent Lorine Bakowsky, was elected the new CA State Regent! Best wishes to Lorine and much gratitude for the leadership and friendship of our past State Regent, Maria Santos Silva, and her board.

There was one discussion item brought to this Parliamentarian's attention during a break in the "action." The question was, "Why do we not have Proxy voting when there are members who want to vote but cannot attend?" Doing due diligence, your Parliamentarian consulted our National Bylaws and Robert's Rules of Order for the proper response. The National Bylaws do not address the use of Proxy votes and default to Robert's Rules. A proxy vote is one given to another member to vote in their stead. Per RONR 12th edition, pages 45:70-71 is states clearly: "proxies are not permitted unless authorized in the constitution or bylaws or required by state law." In addition, our National Supervising Officer was in attendance, who noted that this is the reason we provide the number of delegates and alternates to attend a convention. A delegate speaks for your court vote. Encourage your Court to send an Alternate to speak on behalf of the Court should anything prevent the Delegate from attending the meeting. I am grateful to have had her support a few times just to ensure the process went smoothly.

OUR LADY OF WALSINGHAM

In 1061, Saxon, noble woman, lady, Richeldis de Faverches, had a series of visions of the Virgin Mary, who showed her the house in Nazareth where the angel Gabriel made his revelation of the forthcoming birth of Jesus. Our Lady asked Richeldis to build a replica of the holy house in Walsingham, England.

Through the intercession of angels, who helped build the shrine when workmen could not, the Holy House was built and became a place of pilgrimage – called the Nazareth of England. A spring of water rose at the spot the angels built the house. In 1538, Henry VIII's dissolution of Catholic Pories and Shrines caused the shrine to be burned and torn asunder.

Our Mother said, "Do all this unto my special praise and honor. And all who are in any way distressed or in need, let them seek me here in that little house you have made. To all that seek me there shall be given succor."
